# Methodology | Pennsylvania 2019

Club for Growth Foundation publishes the scorecard study so the public can monitor the actions and the voting behavior of Pennsylvania’s elected state lawmakers on economic growth issues.

The Foundation conducted a comprehensive examination of each lawmaker’s record on votes related to pro-growth policies and computed an Economic Growth Score on a scale of 0 to 100. A score of 100 indicates the highest support for pro-growth policies.

**The Foundation examines legislative votes related to the Club’s immediate pro-economic growth policy goals, including:**

- Reducing or eliminating tax rates and enacting tax reform
- Limited government through limited spending and budget reform
- Regulatory reform and deregulation
- Ending abusive lawsuits through medical malpractice and tort reform
- Expanding school choice
- Implementing term limits

Not all of these policy goals will come up for a vote in each legislative session.

The Foundation also examined votes on bills that would directly harm these goals.

This scorecard is based on selected votes of importance to the Foundation, and does not include the complete voting record of any legislator. There are inherent limitations in judging the overall qualifications of any legislator based on a selected voting record, and the Foundation does not endorse or oppose any legislator for public office.

## LEGISLATIVE ACTIONS CONSIDERED IN PENNSYLVANIA IN 2019

The Foundation’s study examined over 1,300 floor votes and, in the end, included 18 Pennsylvania House and 10 Pennsylvania Senate votes.

### COMPUTATION

Scores are computed on a scale of 0 to 100. Each vote or action in the rating is assigned a certain number of points depending on its relative importance. If a lawmaker casts a correct vote, the scorecard will denote it with that number. If a lawmaker casts an incorrect vote, the scorecard will denote that vote with a hyphen (-). Absences are not counted - signified as an “X” on the scorecard - though the Foundation reserves the right to do so if, in its judgment, a lawmaker’s position was otherwise discernible. If a lawmaker was not officially sworn into office at the time of a vote, the scorecard will denote that vote with an “I”.

To provide some additional guidance concerning the scores, each lawmaker was

ranked. Aside from ties, lawmakers with 0% scores are, by default, ranked #203 in the House and #50 in the Senate. Scores and ranks cannot be directly compared between the House and Senate, as different votes were taken in each chamber. If applicable, the study also records a “Lifetime Score” for each lawmaker. This is a simple average of the scores from 2019 and all previous years where the lawmaker earned a score.

In some cases, a lawmaker was not present for enough votes for a meaningful score or ranking to be computed. In such cases “n.a.” for “not applicable” appears. In computing lifetime scores, years with “n.a.” listed instead of a score are not included. Comparing such scores to other members without “n.a.” years may be misleading.

### ADDITIONAL FACTORS

A study of roll call votes on the floor of the Pennsylvania House and Pennsylvania Senate and legislative actions is just that. It cannot account for a lawmaker’s work in committee, advocacy in his party’s caucus meetings, and effectiveness as a leader in advocating pro-growth policies.

# Pennsylvania 2019 | Senate Vote Descriptions

## HB 33

### REPEAL WELFARE PROGRAM

#### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

The general assistance cash benefit program ended under the provisions of Act 80 in 2012. This state-only funded program paid a cash benefit to individuals who did not qualify for federal welfare programs. Act 80 was overturned by the courts on procedural grounds. Following that court decision, the Department of Human Services began operating the program without legislative approval or funding by reallocating funds budgeted for other purposes. Without this legislation that officially repeals the program, Human Services would continue to divert funds into it. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 106-95, on June 19, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 26-24, on June 26, 2019.

## HB 790

### THE 2019-2020 GENERAL BUDGET

#### (CFGF OPPOSES)

When you eliminate the accounting gimmicks,

this appropriations bill represents a 4.7% increase over the previous year's enacted budget. A common benchmark to grade spending increases is the growth rate in population plus inflation, which stood at just 2.1%. Since this bill grows beyond that - more than double - it forces an extra burden on Pennsylvania taxpayers that they shouldn't have to carry. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 138-62, on June 25, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 42-8, on June 27, 2019.

## HB 800

### EXPANDING PARENTAL CHOICE IN EDUCATION

#### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

This bill expands the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program, which helps provide scholarships to about 50,000 low- and moderate-income K-12 students, allowing parents to move them out of their zip-code assigned government-run schools. The bill would increase the size of the EITC program by

\$100 million. This pro-growth legislation also contains a provision to increase the number of tax credits available each year until demand from parents is met. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 111-85, on May 7, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 28-21, on June 11, 2019.

## HB 1166

### WAGE CONTROL INCREASE FOR RIVER PILOTS

#### (CFGF OPPOSES)

Rather than allowing the free market to set prices, the wage for river pilots who navigate trade vessels along the Delaware River and its navigable tributaries is set by law. This legislation increased that wage. Wage rates should be set by the market, not a government dictate. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 197-0, on May 8, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 50-0, on June 18, 2019.

## Pennsylvania 2019 | Senate Vote Descriptions

### HB 1410

#### NEW CRONYISM ZONE

(CFGF OPPOSES)

This bill creates a new Special Fund known as the Military Installation Remediation Fund. It's ostensibly for cleaning up a contaminated water supply near a former military base, but in reality, the funding can be used for transportation infrastructure, economic development costs, payment of debt service for construction, infrastructure, site preparation, etc. In other words, it can become a corporate welfare slush fund for pet projects. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 144-54, on September 25, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 42-7, on November 18, 2019.

### PN01

#### NOMINATION TO LIQUOR BOARD

(CFGF OPPOSES)

Mary P. Isenhour was nominated to fill a vacancy on the Liquor Control Board. Ms. Isenhour's only qualifications seem to be a relationship with Governor Wolf as Chief of Staff, and then as a Senior Advisor to his re-election campaign. She also indicated at the time of her confirmation

that she would continue to work as a lobbyist. The Pennsylvania Senate confirmed Isenhour, 45-5, on June 19, 2019.

### SB 79

#### MINIMUM WAGE INCREASE

(CFGF OPPOSES)

This bill would increase Pennsylvania's minimum wage to \$9.50 by 2022, up from \$7.25 -- a 31 percent increase. The minimum wage is nothing more than a price control on labor. Increasing or expanding the minimum wage often has the opposite desired effect, leading to job losses and shortages. Wages should be set by the free market, not government dictates. The Pennsylvania Senate passed this bill, 42-7, on November 20, 2019. The bill was sent to the House where it awaits further action.

### SB 398

#### PRO-GROWTH REGULATORY REFORM

(CFGF SUPPORTS)

This bill increases legislative oversight of the regulatory process. Specifically, it gives committees additional time to take action on proposed rules. More importantly, the

committees will have the authority to have the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) remove from its agenda final form regulations which the committee either disapproves or requests additional time for review. Current law allows the IRRC to move forward with the approval of regulations despite the actions of the committee. Changing this provision creates a significant legislative check on the regulatory approval process. The Pennsylvania Senate passed this bill, 27-22, on October 22, 2019. The bill was sent to the House where it awaits further action.

### SB 478

#### NEW FARMER FAVORITISM SUBSIDY

(CFGF OPPOSES)

This bill creates a new tax credit subsidy for existing farmers who sell or rent their agricultural assets to new farmers. Distorting the tax code so that lawmakers can play favorites in the private market is not a core function of government. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 201-0, on June 26, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 50-0, on the same day.

## Pennsylvania 2019 | Senate Vote Descriptions

### SR 20

#### STUDY ON VENUE SHOPPING

##### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

In the early 2000s significant reforms were made to address the medical malpractice crisis in Pennsylvania. One of the rule changes limited a plaintiff's ability to "venue shop" in order to have the case heard in a court where judgments ended in larger monetary settlements. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court Civil Procedural Rules Committee announced that it would be recommending changes to the rule that would effectively allow venue shopping to resume. This resolution directs the Legislative Budget and Finance and Committee (LBFC) to conduct an analysis of the impact of the original change. It also directs the LBFC to study the impact of the current proposal by the Civil Rules Procedural Committee. The LBFC would then report its findings to the General Assembly. The Pennsylvania Senate passed this resolution, 31-18, on February 5, 2019.

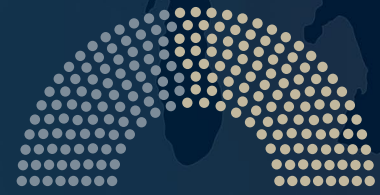

## HB 21

### LICENSING FOR REAL ESTATE INSPECTORS

(CFGF OPPOSES)

Occupational licensure laws restrict innovation and job growth. It's also a prime example of regulatory capture where industry controls its own competition through the political process. This bill would create a new licensing regime for real estate inspectors, including requirements for certification and insurance minimums needed to keep the license. The Pennsylvania House passed the bill, 176-22, on October 30, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

## HB 33

### REPEAL WELFARE PROGRAM

(CFGF SUPPORTS)

The general assistance cash benefit program ended under the provisions of Act 80 in 2012. This state-only funded program paid a cash benefit to individuals who did not qualify for federal welfare programs. Act 80 was overturned

by the courts on procedural grounds. Following that court decision, the Department of Human Services began operating the program without legislative approval or funding by reallocating funds budgeted for other purposes. Without this legislation that officially repeals the program, Human Services would continue to divert funds into it. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 106-95, on June 19, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 26-24, on June 26, 2019.

## HB 410

### QUESTIONABLE WEIGHT LOSS SUBSIDY

(CFGF OPPOSES)

This legislation would add coverage for "anti-obesity" drugs to Pennsylvania's Medicaid program, thus increasing spending for a program that is already unaffordable. The government's role in healthcare needs to be reduced, not expanded. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 188-0, on November 21, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

## HB 629

### MANDATE FOR LYME DISEASE

(CFGF OPPOSES)

This bill mandates health insurance policies to provide coverage for diagnostics and treatments for Lyme disease and related tick-borne illnesses. Mandating coverage increases the costs for insurance companies and those increases will ultimately be passed onto the consumer. Expanding mandates also encourages lobbying efforts for other conditions, and subsequent premium increases for the consumer. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 158-34, on April 10, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

## HB 790

### THE 2019-2020 GENERAL BUDGET

(CFGF OPPOSES)

When you eliminate the accounting gimmicks, this appropriations bill represents a 4.7% increase over the previous year's enacted budget. A common benchmark to grade spending increases

is the growth rate in population plus inflation, which stood at just 2.1%. Since this bill grows beyond that - more than double - it forces an extra burden on Pennsylvania taxpayers that they shouldn't have to carry. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 138-62, on June 25, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 42-8, on June 27, 2019.

### HB 800

#### EXPANDING PARENTAL CHOICE IN EDUCATION

##### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

This bill expands the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program, which helps provide scholarships to about 50,000 low- and moderate-income K-12 students, allowing parents to move them out of their zip-code assigned government-run schools. The bill would increase the size of the EITC program by \$100 million. This pro-growth legislation also contains a provision to increase the number of tax credits available each year until demand from parents is met. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 111-85, on May 7, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed

it, 28-21, on June 11, 2019.

### HB 806

#### LEGISLATIVE APPROVAL FOR NEW REGULATIONS

##### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

This bill would establish an enhanced review process for major regulations that impose a substantial cost burden on the Commonwealth. A major regulation is defined as having an impact on the state, municipalities and/or the business community of \$1 million or more per year. This legislation would require the General Assembly to vote on a concurrent resolution to approve an economically significant regulation before the regulation could go into effect. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 103-91, on April 30, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

### HB 808

#### DELEGATE AWAY AUTHORITY FOR FEE HIKES

##### (CFGF OPPOSES)

Currently, the General Assembly must vote to

increase fees. This bill would allow the Fish and Boat Commission to increase fees on its own unless the General Assembly passed a concurrent resolution stopping the increase. Allowing such fee increases to take place without approval by the General Assembly enables elected lawmakers to avoid responsibility and pass the buck to unelected bureaucrats. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 151-39, on April 17, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

### HB 827 AMDT 1222

#### RESTRICT PRIVATE PROPERTY RIGHTS

##### (CFGF OPPOSES)

The Delaware River Basin Commission (DRBC) declared a drilling moratorium several years ago. This moratorium prevents landowners from realizing the economic benefits that come from accessing the natural gas they have on their own property. The bill would require the DRBC to compensate landowners through eminent domain if they make the moratorium permanent. The Ullman Amendment would essentially negate the purpose of the legislation. The Pennsylvania

House failed to pass this amendment, 81-116, on May 8, 2019.

### HB 855

#### AUTOMATIC SPENDING CUTS

##### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

Under this legislation, the Budget Secretary would be required to estimate the amount, if any, that revenues for the fiscal year would fall short of the official estimate and would be required to place that amount in budgetary reserve starting each December. Following the Independent Fiscal Office mid-year revenue conference, the Budget Secretary's estimate would be revised each month, and the amounts in budget reserve would be adjusted according to each month's revised estimate. This fiscally responsible measure would ensure that taxes collected and money spent match up and that there would not be a budget shortfall to make up in the next year. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 108-90, on June 17, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

### HB 920

#### PREVENT THE RAIDING OF FUNDS

##### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

This bill would set a time limit on appropriated, but unspent money before the funds lapse and return to the State Treasury. It would also prohibit using funds for the creation of new or expanded programs or initiatives. Thus, the legislation would ensure that funds are spent in the way the General Assembly authorized in the budget and are not held and diverted for other purposes. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 108-90, on June 17, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

### HB 1055

#### PRO-GROWTH REGULATORY REFORM

##### (CFGF SUPPORTS)

This bill establishes the "Office of the Repealer" to undertake an independent review of existing regulations and make recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor and Executive agencies for repeal, modification or revision. It would also establish a requirement to repeal two old regulations for every new

regulation enacted. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 103-98, on September 24, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

### HB 1166

#### WAGE CONTROL INCREASE FOR RIVER PILOTS

##### (CFGF OPPOSES)

Rather than allowing the free market to set prices, the wage for river pilots who navigate trade vessels along the Delaware River and its navigable tributaries is set by law. This legislation increased that wage. Wage rates should be set by the market, not a government dictate. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 197-0, on May 8, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 50-0, on June 18, 2019.

### HB 1410

#### NEW CRONYISM ZONE

##### (CFGF OPPOSES)

This bill creates a new Special Fund known as the Military Installation Remediation Fund. It's ostensibly for cleaning up a contaminated

water supply near a former military base, but in reality, the funding can be used for transportation infrastructure, economic development costs, payment of debt service for construction, infrastructure, site preparation, etc. In other words, it can become a corporate welfare slush fund for pet projects. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 144-54, on September 25, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 42-7, on November 18, 2019.

### HB 1437

#### RURAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SUBSIDIES

**(CFGF OPPOSES)**

This bill expands the Rural Jobs and Investment Tax Credit Program (RJITC), which is a program designed to let the government pick winners and losers in the marketplace. In this case, government is favoring small businesses in rural areas at the expense of their competitors. This sort of favoritism is not a core function of government. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 159-41, on June 11, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

### HB 1519 AMDT 1937

#### EXPAND SUBSIDIES FOR CERTAIN CROPS (CFGF OPPOSES)

This amendment gives broad power to the executive branch, allowing the Agricultural Secretary to designate “high-priority specialty crops” to receive subsidies, rather than setting eligible crops by statute through the General Assembly for the block grant program. The Pennsylvania House passed this amendment, 198-0, on June 17, 2019.

### HB 1519

#### BLOCK GRANT SUBSIDIES FOR CERTAIN CROPS

**(CFGF OPPOSES)**

This bill establishes a state-level Specialty Crop Block Grant Program to subsidize crops like hemp, hops, and hardwoods that are not eligible for the federal grants. Using the force of government to favor certain crops and industries at the expense of other crops and industries distorts market prices, expands government, and encourages more spending on corporate welfare. The Pennsylvania House passed this

bill, 200-0, on June 18, 2019. The bill was sent to the Senate where it awaits further action.

### SB 478

#### NEW FARMER FAVORITISM SUBSIDY (CFGF OPPOSES)

This bill creates a new tax credit subsidy for existing farmers who sell or rent their agricultural assets to new farmers. Distorting the tax code so that lawmakers can play favorites in the private market is not a core function of government. The Pennsylvania House passed this bill, 201-0, on June 26, 2019. The Pennsylvania Senate passed it, 50-0, on the same day.
